# Lesson 4 – What is the Work of a Local Church? (How Should We Use the Contribution?)

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**Introduction:** Will we let Jesus be Lord over local churches?

- A. Why not let our Lord tell us *the nature and function* of the local church. (Lk 6:46)
  - 1. We are to be a people that respect God's authority <u>just as Jesus respected the</u> <u>Father's authority</u>. (Jn 14:10-11, 20-21)
  - 2. This submission is <u>a product of knowing God</u> and recognizing that "all things" that we are to do has been delivered through a revealed message. (Jn 17:6-8)
  - 3. It is this attitude that <u>calls us out of the world</u> and <u>causes the world to hate us</u>. (Jn 17:6, 14-17)
- B. The Lord established churches as a spiritual institution with a spiritual mission. The primary function of local churches is <u>to plant God's word in the hearts of men</u>. (Eph 4:11-12; Jn 6:44-45)
  - 1. The "world" makes decisions and determines "standards" *in a very different* way. (Once a goal has been set, then you can lie, cheat, etc. to achieve the goal!)
  - 2. Consider the three ways the world sets "standards."
    - a. What will work? (Utilitarian practicality)
    - b. What do most people accept? (Majority rule)
    - c. Who has *the strength to impose* their will on everyone else? (**Power Politics**)
- "The church which is married to the Spirit of its Age will be a widow in the next."
  —William Ralph Inge (The Cultural Church F. LaGard Smith p. 75)
  - 2. Those churches that "know God" will <u>always ask for authority</u>, that is give book, chapter and verse for "every good work" in scripture. (2 Tim 3:16-17)
- I. Let's take all God has said about local churches and stay within what is revealed
  - A. We are dealing with what a <u>local church</u> may do. This requires that the local church <u>be addressed in the context of a passage</u> before <u>assuming</u> church responsibility.
    - 1. Again what the individual Christian may do is not under consideration!
    - 2. This means *collective* action and *not individual action*.
    - 3. Many have made the mistake that if a local church cannot do a certain work *then the work will not be done*. This is why local churches are increasing involved in things that *should be left to families*. (Ex. Recreational activities)
    - 4. The *bulk of the Lord's work is done by individuals*. You cannot fulfill your work as a Christian by proxy.
  - B. The work of the church involves *that which is authorized* by scripture.
    - 1. Did the Lord provide sufficient instructions <u>to guide us in our collective</u> <u>work</u>? Is there a pattern given to produce uniformity among local churches? (1 Cor 4:17; 7:17; 11:16; 14:33-37)
    - 2. Remember the gospel was spread to the whole world under the arrangements *God authorized for the church in the first century*. (Col 1:23)

- 3. We are first and foremost <u>obligated to give authority (Book, Chapter and Verse)</u> for all that a local church teaches and practices. If we cannot then we should cease that teaching or practice!
- 4. A previous generation wanted to <u>apply Bible authority to the worship</u> of the local church (instrumental music) but not to the work of the local church.
- C. The work of the church involves *the use of its resources* for the work.
  - 1. God has authorized <u>a collection</u> for the work of the local church. (1 Cor 16:1-2)
  - 2. The resources of the local church *constitute the treasury and those things purchased from the treasury* that are *overseen* by the church.
  - 3. This would include the building or other things *purchased from the treasury*.
- D. The work of the church involves that which is wholly (completely) its work.
  - 1. Only that which is authorized may be done with God's approval. To mix that which is authorized in with things that are not authorized is in effect *a substitution for what God has said*.
  - 2. When we are told to preach the gospel that would <u>not include playing baseball</u> <u>or campaigning for a political office</u>. Someone may preach while playing, but playing baseball and preaching the gospel are <u>two separate activities!</u>
  - 3. Error is *most effective* when mixed with lots of truth! (Ex. Rat poison)

## E. How did God *choose to equip His people*? (Eph 4:11-12)

- 1. It is easy to become sidetracked on things that appeal to our flesh but in the end *these things do nothing for the work of God*.
- 2. All apostasy comes from *this desire to satisfy ourselves*. (2 Tim 4:2-4)
- 3. Be prepared! You will be in for a fight with those <u>that close their Bibles</u>! (Rom 8:5-8; Jer 6:16-17)
- 4. When Bibles are closed it is easy to be comfortable with <u>the things that we have always done</u>. When one generation is satisfied with abandoning the need for authority in one area then the next generation <u>will go much further</u>.
- 5. We are laying *a foundation for reason and discussion*. Discussion without a foundation will create confusion and anger!!

## III. What is the work of the local church in evangelism?

- A. God has authorized local churches to be involved in <u>the preaching of God's word</u>. (Phil 4:15-16; 2 Cor 11:8)
  - 1. God's word will not return unto Him void. Let us teach it to all! (Isa 55:11)
  - 2. When scripture gives authority to act, then <u>all things necessary to complete that action are authorized</u> even though they may not be specifically named. Some have described this principle as "<u>general authority</u>."
  - 3. When God specifies a particular thing to be done then <u>we must do what is</u> <u>specified</u>. When God specifies then we must not substitute! Some have described this as <u>specific authority</u>.
- B. A church has <u>several possible choices</u> under general authority. They could pay a preacher, buy tracts, have a radio or TV program, conduct a gospel meeting, or publish ads in the newspaper as long as <u>the gospel alone is preached</u>.

#### C. There are things these verses *do not authorize*:

#### 1. Some other activity

- a. False doctrine is not authorized.
- b. Political campaigns are not authorized.
- c. Recreation is not authorized. (Example: How would a Ping-Pong table be considered as an aid to preaching the gospel?)

#### 2. Violation of other scriptural principles

- a. The local church would not use an arrangement like the missionary society. Why? Because of what the Bible teaches about *the organization* of a local church. (We will study this in the next lesson.)
- b. We are not <u>to substitute for the drawing power of the gospel</u> by an appeal to the flesh. (Jn 6:44-45; 26-27, Rom 1:16-17)

#### IV. What is the work of the local church in edification?

- A. To edify means to build others up by teaching God's word.
  - 1. Edification occurs when God's word is received in one's heart. (Acts 20:32)
  - 2. In edification there is no substitute for God's word. (Eph 4:15-16)
- B. God has authorized local churches <u>to be involved in the edifying of its members</u>. (Acts 9:31; 1 Cor 14:26)
- C. A church has several <u>possible choices under general authority</u>. They could have Bible classes, distribute printed material, use an overhead projector, publish a church bulletin as long as this is <u>the teaching found in God's word</u>.
  - 1. There are some things <u>required under specific authority</u>! They must have an assembly of the whole church to do certain things.

#### (1 Cor 14:23; Acts 20:7; 1 Cor 16:1-2)

- 2. We must have an assembly *on the first day of the week*.
- D. There are things these verses *do not authorize*:

### 1. Some other activity

- a. Again, *false doctrine* is not authorized. It is also condemned.
- b. Political campaigns are not authorized.
- c. <u>Recreation</u> is not authorized. (Example: How would a Ping-Pong table be considered as an aid to edifying Christians?)
- d. <u>Social functions</u> are not authorized such as "fellowship" halls, church parties, church camps.

## 2. Violation of other scriptural principles

- a. If the Bible classes where made into their own separate functional body.
- b. Women preachers would be a violation of 1 Cor 14:33-34.

## V. What is the work of the local church in relieving needy members?

A. God has authorized local churches to be involved *in the relief of its members*. (Acts 2:44-45; 4:32-35; 6:1-6; 11:27-30; Rom 15:26; 1 Cor 16:1-4; 2 Cor 9:12-14)

1. Remember that we are considering *the collective work* of the local church.

- Because a local church is limited in its work that <u>does not limit the scope of</u> what an individual Christian may do!
- 2. When all these verses are considered then what is the work of a local church?
- 3. The work of the church is not *to eliminate all poverty and disease in the world*!
- B. A church has <u>several possible choices under general authority</u>. They could buy or rent a building, provide caregivers or buy services of a hospital or nursing facility. (Acts 6:1-7)
- C. There are things these verses *do not authorize*:
  - 1. Some other activity
    - a. <u>Recreation</u> is not authorized. (Example: How would a Ping-Pong table be considered as an aid to reliving a needy Christian?)
    - b. A business arrangement.

#### 2. Violation of other scriptural principles

- a. Use of another organization.
- b. Church hospitals, church business...

#### VI. What is the difference between man's opinion and that which God requires?

- A. If we have no authority to act then <u>this is walking beyond what is written</u>. This is more than just an opinion! (1 Cor 4:6-7)
  - 1. Please be careful not to label a question as "opinion" and then to cease studying.
  - 2. I do not want someone to become obsessed with this issue either. You may need to take a break and come back to these questions later.
  - 3. I am not disappointed that some may disagree with me on some applications. True growth in knowledge and wisdom <u>often comes with conflict and struggle!</u> Let us continue to study and work together as Christian who love each other.
- B. There is <u>room for opinions</u> within that which is already <u>proven to be authorized</u>. Expediency exists <u>only when a thing is authorized</u>. (1 Cor 6:12; 10:23)
  - 1. I may eat meat and you eat only vegetables. Tastes and opinions will differ.
  - 2. However, I need to be a servant and be mindful of the effect my actions may have on others. Remember, *a thing may be lawful but "not edify.*"
  - 3. In a collective work <u>this becomes crucial</u>. How we use our treasury should be done with great care and communication! (1 Cor 10:23-24; 31-33)
  - 4. Example should we paint the auditorium in pink and purple polka dots?

#### Conclusion: Let the local church be the local church!

- A. When we seriously attempt to apply Bible authority to the local church it is <u>not</u> <u>difficult to find how we can work together in a local church</u>.
- B. When one generation refuses to apply Bible authority to the work and organization of a local church, then it is not surprising to see *the next generation reject the application of Bible authority in its entirety!*
