#### A Study of Angels and Demons Lesson 3 – The Providence of God and Spiritual Beings <u>www.uvachurch.com</u>

Introduction: God wants us to know that He will provide and care for His people.

- A. God tells us how to have fellowship with Him so that we can enjoy His unfailing provisions. (Jude 20-21, 24-25)
  - 1. We are to make the building of our faith a priority while we trust God to provide for us as He has promised.
  - 2. God does not give us much information in how and when He acts in these unseen provisions. God tells us what we need to know.
  - 3. Men are prone to give attention to things that are not in the realm of men to change. Consider the plan of salvation. (Rom 10:6-10; Deut 30:11-14)
- B. There are many things about God's providence that we cannot be specifically sure of in our individual lives.
  - 1. While we know the Lord will provide, we do not always how He will do it.
  - 2. Abraham learned this and so did Mordecai. (Esther 4:14)
  - 3. Paul would also grant the possibility of God's actions in meeting Onesimus. (Philemon 1:15)
  - 4. Please be careful in attributing things to God. We could be wrong.

## I. God gives us a glimpse into His providential use of angels

- A. The major function of angels is to minister to us! (Heb 1:14)
  - 1. If just one of these powerful spiritual beings worked for us then how could we fail? God's provisions do not take away man's ability to choose. (Mt 23:37-38)
  - 2. Angels have a limited role given by God.
  - 3. Do we wish to depend upon these mighty provisions? Do we want to fight Satan's forces without God? We then must put on the whole armor of God. (Eph 6:10-14)
- B. The nation of Israel had the arch angel Michael that "stands watch" and plays a role in the delivery of God's people. (Dan 12:1)
  - 1. Satan falsely used the role of angels to tempt Jesus to sin.

# (Ps 91:11-12; Mt 4:5-7)

- 2. God provides for those who walk by faith.
- 3. God did provide for Israel in fulfilling the promise made to Abraham. Angels are described as walking "to and fro throughout the earth." (Zech 1:8-13)
- 4. God wanted His people to know of their invisible presence. He wants us to know that they are a part of how God executes His will. (Ps 103:20-21)
- C. God allowed some to see the invisible role of angels. (2 Kgs 6:14-17)
  - 1. These angelic warriors were already there. Elijah prayed that the Lord would open the eyes of the young man that he "might see."
  - 2. This account would give us only a glimpse into an invisible spiritual battle that is involved in God's care for us.
  - 3. We are urged to see by faith! Are your eyes enlightened? (Eph 1:18-21)

- D. Present day actions of angels towards God's children that encourage us.
  - 1. Angels are witness to what happens to us both good and bad. We can assume that apostles were not unique in this. (1 Cor 4:9)
  - 2. Could we include angels then in the great cloud of witnesses? (Heb 12:1)
  - 3. We should be very careful not to overthrow the faith of a weak brother in Christ. (Mt 18:10; Rom 14:13-15)
  - 4. Angels rejoice at the repentance of one sinner. (Lk 15:10)
  - 5. We will be escorted by angels at death! (Lk 16:22)

#### II. God has given us a glimpse into the actions of Satan and his demons

- A. Satan's power is found in persuasion. (John 8:43-46)
  - 1. Satan is cunning and we cannot match his persuasive abilities.
  - 2. The power of Satan's persuasion is found in deception. He wants you to walk in darkness. (2 Cor 4:3-4; Eph 5:11; 6:11-12)
  - 3. Satan's war is against knowledge, he wants to deny you access to the truth. You however must be willing to let him do his work. (Matt 13:19)
- B. Demons are involved in this persuasion.
  - 1. Where did idolatry come from? They were drawn by demons! (Lev 17:7; Deut 32:17; 2 Chron 11:15)
  - 2. This deception was so powerful that they willingly gave their children. (Ps 106:35-37)
  - 3. We are told that we cannot have fellowship with both God and demons. (1 Cor 10:20-21)
  - 4. Idolatry can take many deceptive forms today.

### (1 Jn 2:14-17; 1 Cor 10:14; Col 3:5; 1 Sam 15:23)

- C. Satan attempts to deceive us about angels!
  - 1. We can fall prey to Satan's deception by speaking of angels beyond what is revealed.
  - 2. Much false doctrine is attributed to lies of men who claim to know more about angels from personal experience. (Col 2:18-19)
  - 3. We must reject any other gospel even if it was supported or taught by angels. (Gal 1:8)
  - 4. Consider how many with "experiences" hate the opening of God's word to "test the spirits." Look at who is greater! (1 Jn 4:1, 4-6)
