Some Things I Sought to Teach My Sons

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Introduction: As Parents we are given the responsibility to teach our children.

- A. Fathers have a great responsibility <u>to mold their sons</u>. (Eph 6:4)
 - 1. When both parents serve God, that teaching is re-enforced. (Prov 1:8-10)
 - 2. This is one of the greatest gifts God can give us. This will only come if we have <u>a genuine faith</u>. Illusions will not get the job done. (2 Tim 1:5)
- B. Our society *truly despises men and the role God has given them*.
 - 1. Men are pushed to <u>become effeminate and passive</u>.
 - 2. Women are taught to become aggressive and abandon the home and married life.
 - 3. We must be humble and daily <u>ask God for help</u>. (Judges 13:7-8)

I. Work is Honorable

- A. We live in a society that places more value on "what can I get" than of a strong character who seeks to be <u>a dependable and hard-working provider</u>.
- B. God expects every man to be the breadwinner for his home. (Gen 2:24; Eph 4:28)
 - 1. The idea here is to provide not only for self, but for others. Some men <u>must</u> <u>mature before marriage</u>!
 - 2. A good man is unselfish with *the fruits of his labor*. (1 Tim 5:8; 2 Thess 3:10)
- C. I want my sons to give their best on any job they take. (Ecc 9:10)
 - 1. An hourly wage is a promise. Will I keep my end? (Eph 6:6-7)
 - 2. What kind of man was God's son, Jesus Christ? (Mark 6:1-3)
 - 3. Imagine meeting Jesus during this period of His life.

II. Service to the Lord Must be First in Their Lives

- A. While work is important, *it is not first*. (Matt 6:33)
 - 1. It is not second, his family is.
 - 2. This kind of man is far more important to his company than the worldly.
- B. I want my sons to overcome their timidity and <u>have an understanding with their employer</u>. (2 Tim 1:6-7)
 - 1. Tell the boss: "I am a Christian and I must be at worship." Gain a promise from him and hold him to it. *Do not back down*!
 - 2. This decision must be *made in the heart*. (Matt 6:24-27)
 - 3. It is difficult for a man to hold this commitment.
 - 4. This commitment <u>must begin in school</u> and continue in work. He will not get some jobs because of this. (Ex. 7th Day Adventist)
- C. Putting the Lord first means *learning self-control*. (Rom 13:11-14)
 - 1. My sons must make it through the teenage years and not be overcome by the "good old boys" who *want to get high for fun*.
 - 2. My sons must learn self-control and turn from outbursts of wrath.

III. God has given the Man the Responsibility of Headship

- A. This is a great responsibility. (Eph 5:22-23)
 - 1. This means *I must do things that I do not want to*.
 - 2. This means that *I put others first*. (Matt 20:28)
- B. What does true headship involve?
 - 1. An acceptance of responsibility. (Not indecisive, vacillating but firm)
 - a. Too many men let their wives lead by doing nothing.
 - b. It is unimaginable to me for a man to bring children into the world and not be a Christian. This will bring problems for your children.
 - 2. An <u>unselfishness that is motivated by love</u>. (Eph 5:25)
 - a. True leadership finds fulfillment in providing what is good for the family. (Ex. Our new dog, kittens and responsibility.)
 - b. Here is where the wise man will listen and learn. (1 Pt 3:7)
 - 3. <u>Leadership in the ways of God</u>. (1 Tim 2:11-12; Phil 2:19-24)
 - a. Real leadership involves service that others run from. I would love to know my sons would be a Timothy.
 - b. Real leadership involves standing for what is right even when you must stand alone. Too many churches have cowardly men.
 - 4. Discerning good and evil. (Heb 5:11-14)

IV. The Value of Kindness, Courtesy and Gratitude

- A. In short, I want my sons to be gentleman.
 - 1. They may not know the books of etiquette, but they <u>must know God's book</u>.
 - 2. This is a quality of Character that *puts others ahead of themselves*.
- B. What are the marks of a great man? (Matt 7:12; Phil 2:3-4)

V. To be as useful as possible in the Lord's Service

- A. There is such a <u>need for workers in the kingdom</u>. (Matt 9:37-38)
 - 1. I want them to take their talents as far as possible.
 - 2. This will require faith and *a willingness to try and learn*.
- B. At the same time I want them to avoid pride. (1 Cor 8:1-2)
 - 1. Some do things to be seen. (Matt 6:5)
 - 2. When men do work for the Lord, they will be blessed!
- C. What example <u>are they seeing</u> in us as parents. (1 Cor 11:1)
- "The best thing parents can spend on their children is time--not money."
 - B. I want my boys to understand that *true success is found in doing the will of God*. (Matt 7:24-27)
