Introduction: Christianity is founded on historical evidence.

- A. Some falsely claim that Christianity is <u>based upon myth or legend</u>. They simply have never examined the foundations of Christianity! (Acts 1:1-3)
 - 1. How can anyone know who is the historical Jesus? Start *with reading the written accounts*!
 - 2. When one makes timely claims about public events in history, then there is <u>a</u> process of reason to determine what is true!
- B. What *changed the disciples of Christ* to become bold proclaimers of these truths?
 - 1. They were eyewitnesses to events that would change any man!
 - 2. Consider the change in Thomas! (Jn 20:26-29)

I. Three key eyewitness events

- A. The disciples saw many things that <u>established proof</u> that Jesus came from God.
 - 1. These same things were also seen by <u>both friends and enemies</u>. Some would not try to reason. (Jn 10:24-25)
 - 2. <u>Honest men</u> could clearly understand the meaning. (Jn 3:2)
 - 3. This evidence gave the disciples <u>strength to stay with Jesus</u>. They still needed a stronger faith for the work Jesus would give them! (Jn 6:67-69)
- B. There are three events seen by some or all of the apostles.
 - 1. The transfiguration of Christ was seen by Peter, James and John. (2 Pt 1:16-18)
 - a. Imagine seeing and hearing Moses and Elijah talking with Jesus.
 - b. Now imagine entering into the presence of God and hearing His voice!
 - 2. <u>The resurrection of Christ</u> was seen by all many times over 40 days! (Acts 1:3)
 - a. This was to be the focal point to establish faith in Christ. There was much accompanying evidence to establish this truth. (1 Cor 15:1-6)
 - b. Imagine the change these appearances caused in the disciples! (2 Pt 1:3)
 - 3. <u>The ascension of Christ</u> was the final eyewitness, historical event. (Acts 1:9)

II. Jesus plainly foretold of His future ascension

- A. Jesus often *foretold of His death and resurrection*. (Lk 9:22-23, 44-45)
 - 1. Because they could not imagine it possible for men to kill Jesus, their prejudice temporarily blinded them.
 - 2. His *enemies plainly understood* His prophecies. (Mt 27:63-64)
- B. Jesus also *plainly foretold of his future ascension* to heaven!
 - 1. Jesus raised the question of His ascension to unbelievers. (Jn 6:62)
 - 2. This event would be a powerful proof of everything He had been saying about being with the Father before His birth. (Jn 8:56-58)
- C. Jesus had Mary not only announce His resurrection but also *His coming ascension*! (Jn 20:16-18)
 - 1. He came from heaven and He would *soon return to heaven*.

2. They did not witness the nature and facts surrounding His birth, but they would be *eyewitnesses to His return*!

III. The ascension of Christ is a crucial element of our hope.

- A. Why do we have a hope of heaven? (Rom 8:24-25; 1 Pt 3:15)
 - 1. There is evidence upon which we can reason.
 - 2. Do we expect to be with God in a preprepared place? Then Jesus <u>ascended to make</u> that very preparation! (Jn 14:2-3)
 - 3. How did Jesus presently get to be <u>at the right hand of God?</u> (Acts 7:55-56)
- B. Jesus' ascension was essential to <u>the full delivery of His inspired, written word!</u> (Jn 16:7-13)
 - 1. Jesus can now work always be with the disciples. (Mt 28:20)
 - 2. Through the Holy Spirit He can now do a perfect work of revealing His full will. We now have it in written words.
- C. Jesus *continues to work for us* at the right hand of God! (Rom 5:10)
 - 1. In heaven he can appeal to God on our behalf.
 - 2. He also works to provide for us in untold ways!

IV. Views of the ascension of Christ

A. The clouds of ascension as seen from earth.

(Mk 16:19-20; Lk 24:50-53)

- 1. Here we have numerous witnesses that give credibility to the event.
- 2. The greatest detail of the viewpoint of earth is found in the book of Acts.

(Acts 1:4-11)

- a. There had been others who ascended to heaven like Enoch and Elijah, but not like Jesus did!
- b. The disciples were filled with wonder and fear at what would come next.
- c. The angel had to remind them "there is work to do!"
- B. The clouds of ascension as seen from heaven. (Dan 7:13-14)
 - 1. Jesus is like a victorious Roman general <u>returning home from victory with the spoils</u>. (Psa 68:18-19; Eph 4:8-13)
 - 2. Imagine the scene as <u>Jesus approached the gates of heaven</u>! (Psa 24:7-10)
 - 3. Do we realize that Jesus gave these gifts to us so <u>that we might work in His kingdom</u>? (Eph 4:16)

IV. These truths about the ascension of Christ should change us.

- A. This is not just an interesting historical fact. It has great implications on our lives.
 - 1. We will be buried and raised <u>because of His resurrection</u>! (Col 2:12)
 - 2. We live a life of hope based on our future ascension! (1 Thess 4:17-18)
- B. Can we see the unseen through the testimony of the Apostles?

Conclusion: Let us let Christ work for each of us at the right hand of God!
