## The Accuser of Our Brethren

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### Introduction: As our opponent Satan is destined for complete defeat

- A. Before Satan is destroyed, he is <u>committed to destroying God's people</u>. (1 Pt 5:8) <u>Satan</u>; literally Adversary, the constant enemy of God and man, a supernatural evil being. – Frieberg
  - The power of Satan in found in <u>his lies and deception</u>. The defeat of Satan comes when truth is made know!
  - This is why <u>light and darkness</u> are a constant theme in the Bible. (Lk 22:52-53; Jn 14:30)
  - B. What is the difference between how Satan speaks and acts and how Christians do?
    - 1. In some ways I believe that darkness is around us in a powerful way right now.
    - Remember that darkness <u>has no power over light</u>! (ESV "the darkness has not overcome it." (Jn 1:4-5)
    - Now is the time to be reminded of the power of God's light manifested in His wisdom. This wisdom is very different from the ways of the world. (Jas 3:13)

## I. Satan's history of making accusations against the people of God

- A. Satan is the accuser of our brethren! (Rev 12:10)
  - 1. He is filled with wrath and even accuses us before God! (Zach 3:1-4)
  - 2. Satan did not anticipate forgiveness through the sacrifice of Christ.
  - 3. God does not cast us away when we stumble or are weak!
- B. Satan tried to destroy God's people through accusations! (Ezra 4:6)
  - 1. How does Satan use accusations? He uses them to destroy! (Jn 10:10)
  - Satan <u>does not care if accusations are true</u>, but he wants to appeal to the fear and anger in men. He wants the accusation to work! (Ezra 4:12-13)
  - This is like a fire. How far does it spread? It depends on if it has fuel. Wise men with integrity will not be fuel for such a fire.
- C. How were God's people instructed to respond? (Psa 109:2-4)
  - 1. Is it weakness to respond to accusations with love and prayer? NO!
  - Satan wants you and I to <u>take on personal vengeance</u> and in that we will destroy ourselves! (Rom 12:19-21; 1 Pt 2:23)
  - 3. When we refuse to do this we will become like our accusers. How? Poison will seep into our hearts!
  - When we <u>refuse mercy</u> we will be destroyed! This cancer will enter into our very "body" and "bones." (Psa 109:16-18; 1 Jn 3:15)

# II. Satan and the political culture of our times

- A. In this culture, "ammunition" for the battle is seeking charges to attack another.
  - What did the Pharisees <u>diligently pursue</u>? (Lk 6:7; Mk 3:2)
  - If you want something bad enough you will find it. When love, justice and mercy are cast out, you can believe anything! (Mt 23:23; 2 Thess 2:11)

- I am concerned that this kind of thinking <u>can enter into our "bones"</u> through the current political culture.
- B. This culture is very quick to accuse! (Jude 9)
  - The Romans had a process that when applied, would defeat slander. Righteousness takes time and effort! (Acts 25:16; Prov 18:17)
  - When you <u>blindly follow a party</u> then when your "leader" makes an accusation then no further investigation is needed! (Jn 18:29-30)
- C. This culture is quick to incite "mob action!" (Ex 23:1-2; Acts 19:32)
  - We should not go "public" <u>as a first act!</u> This is how Satan tempts many people. "Why are you not doing something!"
  - Even if legitimate problems are raised Satan's goal is the same, to destroy your enemy and enslave the victor! <u>He conquers both!</u>
  - 3. We must be very careful about our social media or discontinue it entirely.
  - 4. In the 1930's several articles warned against <u>"petitions" and majority rule</u>. I would add to that warning concerning "open letters" and the internet!
- D. All of this is contrary to <u>the very foundation of God's wisdom</u>. (Lev 19:18; Mt 22:37-40)

### III. The blessings of being with the people of God

- A. When we are converted, we radically change how we view everything! (Lk 19:8-10)
  - 1. God has now given us a different set of priorities! (Mt 6:33)
  - 2. I am not taking on burdens the world thrusts upon me. We need wisdom here!
  - 3. When we are "not of this world" we will be fighting for different things than political power. (Jn 18:36)
- B. When we are with Christians, we can trust one another. (1 Cor 13:4-6)
  - Trust is built on <u>how we handle problems!</u>
  - I will close my heart to blunt, unprincipled force. God's love in a humble heart is the key to working together! (Jn 8:10-12)
  - When I have a different opinion, I appreciate the one who <u>puts others first</u>.
    (James 3:17-18)
- C. What do we need the most to overcome these toxic times?
  - 1. We must never forget how God has forgiven each of us. (Lk 7:42, 47)
  - 2. When I replace the current static with thanksgiving, I must start here!
  - 3. Do you remember your conversion? Do you know what it means to be lost?
  - All of our current troubles <u>are temporary</u>. These weird times will not last! (Ex. Memory of Pandemic of 1918) (1 Cor 7:29-31)
- D. I am so thankful for my brethren who are <u>full of thankfulness, mercy and love</u>! (1 Thess 3:6-8)
  - 1. Let us withdraw from the worldly static and become closer to one another.
  - 2. When we see things as God does, we learn what lasts! (Ex. New car in 2015)

Conclusion: God's wisdom will always overpower the darkness of this world!
